## Pastor's Point of View



Greetings Friends!

As I write this I have just finished a conference held at the Peachtree Presbyterian Church in Atlanta. It was a good conference and I was able to see several friends that I haven't seen since seminary or many years. It was great to catch up with them, as well as make some new friends!

The theme of the conference was, "Come Together, Discipleship in a Divided Time: find unity in Christ, strengthen the church, engage the Culture". The speakers and worship times were very good and dealt with various types of division we are facing in our society today. Some were very thought-provoking as we wrestled with how to present a very divided world with the love of Jesus Christ.

On Wednesday, all of the conference attendees were handed a box lunch and were loaded on buses to take us to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial. It was a moving experience to reflect again on the horrible evil of racism that continues to haunt our nation, even today, and how one man felt called by God to try to make a difference through love and non-violence. Using Biblical principles and teaching, and the example of non-violence exhibited by Mahatma Gandhi to overcome racism in India, Martin Luther King, Jr. sought to change the injustice that he saw around him. It was good to reflect on, again, how one person can make a difference and be used by God to change the world around them.

The world today definitely needs people who are bold enough to put their lives on the line as followers of Jesus Christ, and speak out against injustice wherever they see it. How disturbing it was to be reminded once again of the evil and violence people have inflicted upon others, even in my lifetime, and to realize that many of those problems are still with us today.

Many years ago, I heard Billy Graham being interviewed and he was asked what he thought was the biggest problem in the world today. He replied, "Racism". At that point in my life, I didn't understand his answer, but the longer I live, I more I have come to believe he was right.

Here was another man, a humble farmer from North Carolina, who was called by God to make a difference in the world. Billy Graham never wavered from his understanding of the call of God to preach the gospel to all nations. He treated all people, from the heads of nations to the common person on the street the same and showed them the love of Christ and his message was the same: all of us are sinners, but God so loved the world that He gave His only Son to die on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. It has been estimated that that over 250 million people are in the kingdom of heaven today because they responded to Billy Graham's simple presentation of the Good News.

I remember the two times I was blessed to be in his presence and each time, I was struck by his humility. The first was when he came to Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary when I was a student. Here was perhaps the greatest evangelist since the Apostle Paul, and yet I was surprised by his deep humility and respect he displayed towards the Seminary, of which he was a Board Member.

The next time I was blessed to meet Dr. Graham was over twenty years ago when I was working with a group of pastors to bring the John Wesley White and Franklin Graham Crusade to the Kanawha Valley. The Crusade was held at the Civic Center and Billy Graham had just returned from leading the funeral for Richard Nixon, and on his way home, he stopped in Charleston to be with his son, Franklin. This was the first time they were together in a Crusade. Their love and respect for each other was admirable, and the similarities in their mannerisms was obvious. Once again, Billy Graham displayed his humility as he greeted each pastor back stage and thanked us for our

work in the Crusade. The presence and the power of God was electrifying as we held a time of prayer together.

Two men heard the call of God on their lives. They obediently followed their calls, and the impact of their ministries was felt around the world.

There is still a lot of work to be done. What is God calling you to do to make a difference in TVPC and in our community?

The Bible says in Micah 6:8, "... What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God."

What would happen if each of us would begin each day asking God to show us how we can be obedient to this command to do justice, love kindness and to walk humbly with our God?


May this be our prayer during Lent and every day of our lives and we will make this world a better place!

Your generous help is needed and is greatly appreciated. We can’t wait to get started on this exciting project!




We plan to visit Recovery Point a month before the conference and personally invite each woman to come and be with us.

As a money-making venture to help pay for our speaker and other expenses, we will offer the Vibella Jewelry, made by ladies in impoverished countries (we had a Vibella sale a couple years ago, and found the jewelry to be quite nice and popular with everyone).

Also in the planning stage is our refreshments. We are thinking about offering cookies and drinks Friday evening, and muffins, sweet breads and drinks Saturday morning. Marci has talked to Brittany Higginbotham of Sweet B's Pies and Treats about making the food.

As you can see, there is work for many helping hands, and we are hoping that all of our TVPC sisters will join us as we plan for this special weekend for women to come together and grow in our faith. 
