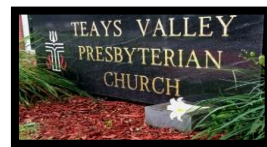

The Mission Outreach Ministry Team has been discussing our traditional Sharing Christmas mission. Our discussions, concerns, and prayers for this mission started over a year ago. The team chose to read the book *When Helping Hurts* and then discussed the premise of the book, to build relationships with families in need and help them learn to take care of themselves. Giving of material items is helpful and necessary only during times of tragedy or catastrophe.

We have looked seriously at our Sharing Christmas mission...getting names of Putnam County children, purchasing a bag of gifts, and having a party where we would give them their gifts. To try something new, team members then talked about going out to the families in Putnam County, including an afternoon of gathering children and their families at Sable Point and Devonshire, planning fun activities, a Christmas craft, singing Christmas carols, telling the Christmas story and sharing our friendship with families at each of these places. A third Sharing

Christmas gathering would be at our church, inviting the families at both Sable Point and Devonshire. However, after talking to the property managers at both places, we learned that we cannot host a Christmas party at either place and share the news of Christ's birth.

The Mission Outreach Ministry Team has chosen to adopt 30 children from the Salvation Army/Teays Ministerial Association from their registration of children and families in Putnam County. We have helped with this mission for many years and know that we are counted on to help with the approximately 200 families and 500-600 children with needs in our county. The tags for the names of our "adopted" children will be posted Sunday, November 11. Gift bags will be taken to the Nazarene Church where, with all the other churches in the counties, the bags will be given out to the families.

Plans for Sharing Christmas at TVPC this year will look a bit different. The Mission Outreach team has decided to work with the Discipleship Ministry Team and build on the Advent Family Nights they planned last December. Thinking that this could be a whole church mission, there would be three Sunday night Family Christmas Story evenings in December, on the 2nd, 9th, and 16th. Several MOMT members have recently shared how meaningful the Christmas experience was years ago at TVPC, when everyone crowded into the Narthex and heard and shared Christmas stories. The Mission Outreach team is thinking we could have this for our church members, but also invite local families who would like to be a part of this Christmas gathering. In addition to telling stories, we could offer the opportunity for everyone to share their family traditions. We could have a soup supper, plan a Christmas craft for the family to work on together, and sing Christmas carols together. One of the three evenings together, families could bring donations and work together filling the Christmas boxes for the Samaritan's Purse.

We ask for prayers from everyone as we make these changes. Our hope is for all of us to come together with this mission, and that we will find a special joy this Christmas as we celebrate the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

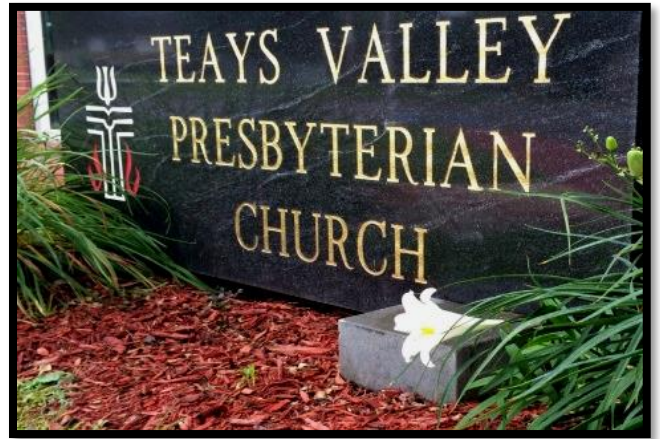
